

TOWN OF DRAYTON VALLEY
BY-LAW 2001-06

A by-law of the Town of Drayton Valley in the Province of Alberta to **amend** By-law # 2000-09, being a by-law to provide for the regulation, control and management of: vehicle and pedestrian traffic and highways within the Town; and the transportation of Dangerous Goods within the Town.

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Drayton Valley deems it advisable to amend By-law 2000-09 under the provisions set out in the Municipal Government Act, 1994, Chapter M-26.1 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta .

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Town of Drayton Valley, duly assembled, hereby enacts as follows:

- By-law No. 2000-09 be amended by revising the definition of "Heavy Vehicle" under the Definitions Section; and Section 301(2) "Heavy Vehicle Route" as follows:

Definition of "Heavy Vehicle"

"Heavy Vehicle" means a vehicle that has a certificate weight of more than 7,500kg (16,500 lbs.) or exceeds 10 meters (32 feet) in length, *with the exception of recreation vehicles as defined by this bylaw.*

"Recreation Vehicle" means a vehicle or trailer that is designed, constructed and equipped, either temporarily or permanently, as a dwelling place, living abode or sleeping place.

Section 301(2) - Heavy Vehicle Route

No person shall park a heavy vehicle for more than 120 minutes on any highway within the Town, and at no time shall a heavy vehicle be parked within five (5) meters (16 feet) of a driveway or intersection, *with the exception of privately owned commercial property that allows overnight parking, and is adjacent to a heavy truck route.*

This by-law shall come into force and have effect from and after the date of third reading.
