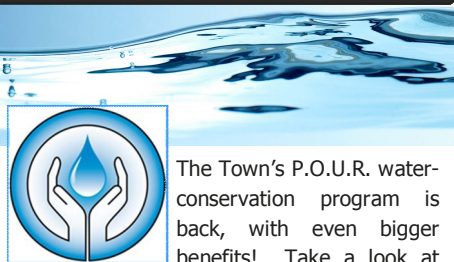


DISCONNECT TO CONNECT

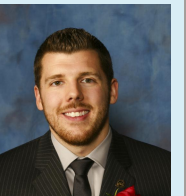
