

Safe and Healthy Communities Allocation

Applicant Quick Reference

The intent of the revenues generated through Automated Traffic Enforcement is to be used towards community safety initiatives, community health and resiliency initiatives, and activities geared toward groups with health and safety mandates.

Organizations seeking access to the funds (up to 50% of the net revenue in the Safe and Healthy Community Reserve*) must meet the eligibility criteria**.

Eligible organizations or services must:

- be based in Drayton Valley and supported by the Drayton Valley community at large;
- not duplicate already existing services in the community, or show that duplication is necessary in order to meet community needs;
- provide opportunities for community access and involvement within their organization, without regard to race, sexual orientation, religion, creed, gender, or disability;
- carry adequate insurance to protect any sponsoring agency; and
- show continuing effort in remaining financially independent and viable.
- provide a budget or business plan for the service requiring support, showing anticipated revenue sources and expenditures.

Application for the funds will be accepted by way of Proposal. A complete listing of the information included in a Proposal is set out in the Town's Automated Traffic Enforcement Fund Allocation Policy A-04-14. A copy of the policy is available on the Town's website:

Review Process:

Applications for access to the Safe and Healthy Communities Allocation will be considered throughout the year, with proposals going to a Regular Meeting of Council as required for a formal decision.

* *The amount in the Automated Traffic Enforcement Reserve for as of December 31st, 2015 is \$120,180. The amount that has been accumulated in 2016 will be reflective of the remittance of funds from the Alberta Government.*

** *The Town recognizes that certain major community events may be organized and hosted for the Town and its surrounding communities by local organizations or committees. These events may fall within the umbrella of the general operations of the Town and may be excluded from receiving support allocation. The approval of these events is at the discretion of Town Council.*
