

Council Approves Automated Traffic Enforcement Fund Allocation Policy

April 20th, 2016

DRAYTON VALLEY – Town Council has adopted the Automated Traffic Enforcement Fund Allocation Policy which sets the framework in which funds will be utilized for the benefit of our community.

As outlined in the policy, funding received from ATE will be held in reserves and allocated to Town initiatives or programs that will contribute to a safe and healthy community. Funding through the Safe and Healthy Community Reserve can be accessed through a granting process.

Additionally, the policy provides for the allocation of the reserve funds as follows:

Up to fifty percent (50%) – Safe and Healthy Community Allocation;

No less than forty (40%) – Life-cycle Capital Replacement Plan; and

Up to ten percent (10%) – Participatory budget

"Following the policy first established when the Automated Traffic Enforcement Fund was approved, money from this fund can accessed for projects that meet the goals of safe and health community initiatives." says Mayor Glenn McLean
