**BACKGROUND ON IMPLEMENTATION:**

With the calling of a By-election for a vacant Council position, Council included a Vote on Questions regarding the continued use of Automated Traffic Enforcement (ATE) within the Town. Two questions were posed to electors, with results, though not binding on Council as per section 236(2) of the MGA, as follows:

Do you support the continuation of the photo radar (Red Light/Stop Sign) enforcement program in the Town of Drayton Valley?

256 Yes            785 No            (3% Spoiled, Rejected or Unmarked)

Do you support the continuation of the photo radar (Speed) enforcement program in the Town of Drayton Valley?

283 Yes            746 No            (4% Spoiled, Rejected or Unmarked)

Council now has the opportunity to consider a plan concerning the continuation of an Automated Traffic Enforcement (ATE) Program in the Town of Drayton Valley.

**Options Available to Council:**

1. That Council direct Administration to provide notice of termination to the service provider for termination of the Automated Traffic Enforcement (ATE) Program as soon as is practicable, and in no case later than April 30, 2017.
2. That Council consider a longer termination notice period during which engagement may be undertaken with RCMP, Provincial Sheriffs, and contracted CPOs to address continuity of service levels following the termination period. Accordingly, Council directs Administration to provide notice of termination to the service provider for the orderly termination of the Automated Traffic Enforcement Program no later than June 30, 2017.
3. That Council direct Administration to provide notice of suspension of active ticketing under the current Automated Traffic Enforcement (ATE) Program.
4. That Council maintain an Automated Traffic Enforcement (ATE) Program within the Town for the following services:
  - a. Both Stop Sign/Red Light and Speed Enforcement;  
OR
  - b. Stop Sign/Red Light Enforcement;  
OR
  - c. Speed Enforcement.
