## COUNCIL DECISION ITEMS

### DRAYTON VALLEY-BRAZEAU RECREATION BOARD BYLAW 2020/01/C

The Joint Exploratory Recreation and Culture Ad Hoc Committee was established by the Town of Drayton Valley and Brazeau County to advise Councils on gaps and issues in recreation and culture services. As directed by the Recreation Ad Hoc Committee, Administration prepared a draft By-law which creates the Drayton Valley-Brazeau Recreation Board and sets out its powers and duties. This Bylaw was presented for all three readings and Council gave all three readings to the Drayton Valley-Brazeau Recreation Board Bylaw 2020/01/C, as presented. In addition, Council appointed Councillor Peebles and Councillor Ballas to the Drayton Valley-Brazeau Recreation Board for the term stated in the Bylaw.

### AQUATIC FACILITY COMMITTEE TERMS OF REFERENCE

At the Meeting of Joint Council on December 9, 2019, it was the consensus of Joint Council that all matters pertaining to the proposed Aquatic Centre shall be addressed at Joint Council meetings. Therefore, Administration recommended that Town Council rescind Resolution #189/19 amending the Town's Aquatic Facility Committee Terms of Reference. Additionally, Town Council was requested to dissolve the Aquatic Committee and direct all matters regarding the proposed aquatic facility to Joint Council gatherings. Council rescinded Resolution #189/19 and dissolved with immediate effect the Aquatic Committee. All further discussion items will be referred to at Joint Council Gatherings.

### COMMUNITY DINNERS RESOLUTION #012/20 - ADDITION TO THE AGENDA

Councillor Ballas moved that the Town be a sponsor for Community Dinners, as the organizers are still short two sponsors. This motion was carried and the Town will move forward as a sponsor for one Community Dinner at the MacKenzie Conference Centre.

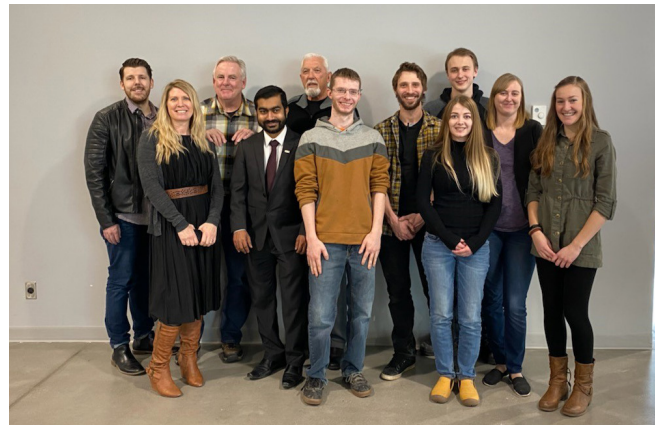
## COUNCIL DECISION ITEMS

### TOWN OF DRAYTON VALLEY SPECIAL EVENT INSURANCE

The Town of Drayton Valley regularly hosts a number of community events which require “Special Event Insurance.” The Town’s insurer has agreed to recognize events which are endorsed by Resolution of Council under the Town’s insurance policy with the exception of activities which are considered “high risk.” Organizers of “high risk” events will be required to provide a certificate of the additional appropriate insurance. Council endorsed the Drayton Valley Triathlon, May 9, 2020; Canada Day Festivities, July 1, 2020 and the Annual Skatepark Jam, as insured activities of the municipality.

### FAMILY DAY EVE FIRE AND ICE FESTIVAL - ROAD CLOSURE REQUEST

The Eagle Point-Blue Rapids Parks Council (EPBRPC) has entered a second year of partnership with the Town in hosting the Family Day Eve Fire and Ice Festival. In anticipation of this year’s increased participation and new activities, EPBRPC is requesting that 52 Street between 51 Avenue and 52 Avenue be closed on February 16, 2020 between the hours of 12:00 pm and 8:30 pm. Council approved the motion for the road closure on February 16, 2020.



### ZERO FEE TUITION

January 6th marked the first day of classes for 18 students who are pursuing a post-secondary education as part of the Zero Fee Tuition program! Six domestic students are enrolled in the Business Administration program and 12 domestic students are taking the Health Care Aide Program through NorQuest College in Drayton Valley! With just over a year of planning behind this initiative, Town Council is thrilled to see this project get off the ground, in what promises to be a very successful first semester.
