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COUNCIL DECISION ITEMS

APPOINTMENT OF DEPUTY MAYOR

The Municipal Government Act (MGA) states Council must appoint one or more councillors as deputy chief elected official so that only one councillor will hold that office at any one time, and the office will be filled at all times. The position of Deputy Mayor for the Town of Drayton Valley is held on a rotating basis for a term of eight months. Councillor Nancy Dodds was appointed Deputy Mayor for the period March 1, 2020 to October 31, 2020.

NEXT STEPS FOR PARTNERS FOR CLIMATE PROTECTION PROGRAM (PCP) MILESTONE FRAMEWORK

With Council Resolution #217/15, the Town of Drayton Valley officially joined the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) Partners for Climate Protection Program (PCP). The PCP program helps municipalities reduce energy use and emissions through a five-step Milestone Framework:

- Milestone 1: Create a Baseline Emissions Inventory and Forecast
- Milestone 2: Set Emissions Reduction Targets
- Milestone 3: Develop a Local Action Plan
- Milestone 4: Implement the Local Action Plan
- Milestone 5: Monitor Progress and Report Results

The Town recently completed Milestone 1 which was reviewed by the FCM in January 2020, and Council support was requested to proceed with the next steps of the PCP Milestone Framework. Council directed Administration to proceed with the next steps of the PCP Milestone Framework, which includes:

Uploading the Energy and Emissions Inventory Report 2015-2018 to the TODV website; start public engagement activities; identify emissions reduction potential, high-level resource requirement and timeline for implementation; and begin data collection and analysis for 2019 inventory.

COUNCIL DECISION ITEMS

TOWN OF DRAYTON VALLEY-BRAZEAU COUNTY INTERMUNICIPAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN (IDP) BYLAW 2020/03/D PRESENTED FOR FIRST READING

Brazeau County Bylaw 1049-20 to adopt the proposed Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) received First Reading at Brazeau County's Regular Council meeting on February 18, 2020. Therefore, Intermunicipal Development Plan Bylaw 2020/03/D is presented for First Reading to Town of Drayton Valley Council.

Compared to the current IDP, major changes include revisions to Referral Area boundaries, reduced referral timelines, elimination of redundant policies and outdated growth projections, and the incorporation of infographics to summarize the IDP. Council gave First Reading to proposed Town of Drayton Valley-Brazeau County IDP 2020/03/D as presented.

MUNICIPAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN, LAND USE BYLAW REVIEW STEERING COMMITTEE

On January 26, 2020, Administration held their first conference call with the project team from ISL Engineering and Land Services to start the MDP/LUB and Signage Bylaw Review and Update. The next step of the project is to appoint a Steering Committee that will sit for the duration of the project. Responsibilities of the Steering Committee include reflecting and commenting on the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats of the project; articulate the interests, concerns, and perspectives being voiced in the community; and provide feedback on draft documents for Administration and the ISL team.

Council appointed one Councillor, and an alternate to the Committee.

SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2020 - 2024

The Town of Drayton Valley and Brazeau County have collaborated on the development of a Social Development Plan. This Plan focuses on enhancing the quality of life for the residents of the community and helps provide a direction for future decisions in key areas identified by the community. The Plan serves in assisting several non-profit community organizations in setting their strategic plans. Grant applications submitted by the municipalities or non-profit organizations are also supported by referencing the Social Development Plan.

The previous plan ended in December 2019, so the draft Plan for 2020-2024 was presented to Council for its review and consideration. Council adopted the Social Development Plan as presented. The Social Development Plan can be viewed in its entirety on our website.
