CARING FOR BACKYARD HENS

Drayton Valley residents are allowed up to three (3) hens per residential property for personal use. No roosters.

01

PREMISES ID PROGRAM NUMBER

Obtain and maintain a valid PID (Premises Identification Program) number through the Government of Alberta at https://partners.agric.gov.ab.ca/pid/

02

COOP SIZE

Provide each hen with at least 0.37 m² of interior floor area, and at least 0.92 m² of outdoor enclosure, within the coop.

03

NEST BOXES AND PERCHES

Within the coop, provide and maintain at least one nest box per hen, and one perch per hen that is at least 15 cm long.

04

ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES

Ensure there is food and water available within the coop. Hens must also be allowed to scratch, dust-bathe, and roost.

05

CLEANING UP AFTER YOUR HENS

Maintain the coop in a sanitary condition, and store collected manure in a fully enlosed container (up to 3 cubic feet at a time).

HEN ENCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS

Coop Area ①

Provide each hen with at least 0.37 m² (4 sq. feet) of interior floor area.

Hen Run 2


Provide each hen with at least 0.92 m² (10 sq. feet) of outdoor enclosure within the coop.

Coop Height (max.) ③

The coop must not exceed 2.4 metres in height.

Overall surface area 4

The overall surface area of the coop's indoor and outdoor portions must not exceed 10 m² (108 sq. feet).
